Penn Introduction




- The United States' oldest university founded in 1740

Course Options



- Enroll in a total of 4 course units per semester
 - 50% of courses must be through the School of Arts and Sciences (College of Arts and Sciences or the College of Liberal and Professional Studies)
 - The remaining 2 courses can be from any other school at Penn (Wharton, Engineering, Annenberg, etc.)
- Courses outside of the School of Arts and Sciences require permits and are not guaranteed
- All courses must be at the undergraduate level (4999 and below)

- Flexible structure is designed to inspire curiosity and frame opportunities for students to pursue inquiry and discovery, follow their passions, and address the world's most challenging problems





Housing







Sawiris Penn Scholars Programming



Sawiris Penn Scholars enjoy unique programming throughout the year, which will include:

- Special residential pre-orientation integration program
- Regular access to Sawiris Program Manager and Faculty Director
- Luncheon programs with Penn Global leaders
- Trips to New York City and Washington DC
- Special campus programs, such as curated tour of Penn Museum's Egyptian Galleries
- Cultural activities including sporting events, museum outings, etc.

Additional activities integrated with the Exchange at Penn (EAP) program provide opportunities to engage in programming with visiting exchange students from around the world.



Student Visa & International Student Support

- Exchange students will apply for a J-1 student visa. Detailed instructions on how to obtain a visa are provided upon acceptance.
- International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) is Penn's dedicated team for providing inclusive, innovative and impactful immigration and integration services.
- Students are assigned a designated ISSS advisor who is the go-to person for immigration questions.

Program Costs/Stipend



With great appreciation to a generous gift from the NNS Foundation — a charity fund settled by Nassef Sawiris — and in collaboration with the Sawiris Foundation in Egypt, the Sawiris Penn Scholars Exchange Program students receive a full scholarship which covers:


- Full tuition and fees at the University of Pennsylvania for a full academic year (two semesters)
- Roundtrip airfare to Philadelphia
- Housing and dining on campus
- Health insurance
- Living stipend



Program Eligibility



- Current full-time undergraduate students enrolled at Ain Shams University's Faculty of Engineering who have completed at least 2 years of study
- Minimum 100 TOEFL IBT/7.5 IELTS Score/120 Duolingo
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 required
 - 3.3 or higher preferred





Course Equivalence: UPenn vs. ASU

Senior 1 (Fall/Spring-USA)

- 4 Courses Engineering School
- 4 Courses School of Art & Science (Equivalent in ASU: 2 Minor Courses from Semester 8, 2 Minor Courses from Semester 10.)

Senior 1 (Summer-ASU

- 2 Engineering Courses, and up to 3 courses available. (Free provided student keep Academic Record).
- By this stage, student covered 6/7 Engineering courses out of 10 and 4 Minor courses.
- With total 9 courses out of 12 required in Senior 1

Senior 2 (Fall & Spring ASU) • Student Register in 2 to 3 Courses in Semester 9& 10 and Graduate in Spring 2024

Senior 2 (Summer 2024) • Alternate Option: Student can register in remaining courses for Free (1 or 2 Courses). And Graduate in Summer 2024


